Men whose strong dedication to their Church back in February 1,1882 accepted Father Michael J. McGivney's invitation to gather in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Ct. His hope was to unite men in their faith and provide for Catholic families in times of need. Council Activities

Business meetings are held twice a month during the Fall, Winter and Spring on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday, at 7:00 pm, at the Council House. During the Summer months, meetings are held on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 7:00 pm in the Council House.

Our council hosts a large number of council activities throughout the year. These include: Bingo on Friday evenings; Crab dinners on Tuesday evenings, the Sunday breakfast buffet , fish fry, beef-on-the-bay, crab cake platters, and fried chicken dinners.

Annual activities include: New Year's Eve Party, St. Patrick's Day party, Christmas Party, Easter Egg Hunt, hosting the annual Knights of Columbus Convention, conducting the Tootsie Roll drive, operating the local Hoop Shoot contest together with Ocean City Elks Club, Christmas Bazaar, participation in the March for Life in Washington, D. C., and an annual Super Bowl party.

Family Activities

The Family Activities Committee has one basic goal and that is to strengthen family life. We attempt to do this by nourishing wholesome home life through the sponsorship of activities involving entire families on a scheduled and continuing basis. We attempt to encourage communications and routines which involve family members within their own homes, and bring families together in social and recreational events in the community. Some of the family activities that Council 9053 has promoted and would like to expand on are:

Youth Activities

Over 1800 youths take part in one or more of our programs. Awards range from certificates, plaques, trophies, soccer balls, baseballs, to saving bonds. Participants are recognized at the celebration of Mass, on the sport field of competition, or at the Knights Council Home. Volunteers who help with our youth activities donate four to six hours of their time. This is an activity where the father of young children along with others can enjoy a sports activity with young children and all will be involved in an activity related closely with a Catholic Men's Organization. Some of the activities are: Easter Egg Hunt, Free Throw Contest (conducted jointly with the Ocean City Elks), the Soccer Shootout, and Substance Abuse Poster Contest. Carroll W.
